Women's Health, Masculinities, and Empowerment:
Advocacy and Leadership Training

Sonke Gender Justice and the University of California Global Health Institute (UCGHI) Center of Expertise on Women's Health & Empowerment are partnering to offer a new intensive, short course at the intersection of women's health empowerment and male engagement.

Through interdisciplinary case studies and exercises, participants will learn how to build women's empowerment and gender norms transformation into health programmes and advocacy activities to maximize their effectiveness.

Sonke works across Africa to strengthen government, civil society, and citizen capacity to promote gender equality, prevent domestic and sexual violence, and reduce the spread and impact of HIV and AIDS. Sonke's flagship program – MenEngage Africa Training Initiative (MATI) – is building a network of gender justice advocates.

The UCGHI's mission is to train the next generation of global health leaders, and accelerate the discovery and implementation of transformative global health solutions.

- Design and measure empowerment interventions for health
- ◆ Analyze, and adapt for implementation, case studies in women's health, masculinities and empowerment
- Develop and implement a program intervention incorporating women's health, masculinities, and empowerment
